## Hotel Sacher

Philharmonikerstrasse 4, 1010 Wien



Hotel Sacher Wien was opened in 1876 by Eduard Sacher, the son of the creator of the famous Original Sacher-Torte. Soon the hotel became world famous as a popular meeting place for personalities from the peerage, politics, business & arts.

Today the hotel is privately run by the Gürtler family. It is located in the pedestrian zone in the city centre, directly opposite the Vienna State Opera, next to the Albertina gallery and just a few minutes walk from the elegant Ringstraße boulevard, St. Stephen's Cathedral and Hofburg Palace.

In October 2006 the luxury hotel was enlarged by two additional roof floors which will afford a unique view over the whole city and boast 42 new rooms, a business area and a spa area including salt steam bath, historical sauna, relaxing oasis, herbal sauna, massage and cosmetic treatments with beauty products of La Prairie & Ligne St. Barth. But the top attractions certainly are the "Hot Chocolate Treatments" by Sacher.

The world famous Hotel Sacher Wien opposite the State Opera - and its genuine Original Sacher-Torte - is an Austrian institution and a landmark of Vienna like the Spanish Riding School and St. Stephen's Cathedral. Hotel Sacher Wien, which has twice been designated as the best hotel in Austria, offers 152 traditional luxury rooms & suites with elegant furniture, choice antiques and fine fabrics create a warm and luxurious atmosphere. Moreover, beautiful paintings and other decorative pieces of art give each room its own unique character and style.

As part of construction, which last until the end of October 2005, the hotel enlarged by two additional roof floors which afford a unique view over the whole city and boast 42 new rooms, a 3229 square feet spa area (featuring a salt steam bath, a historical sauna, a relaxing oasis, a herbal sauna, massage and cosmetic treatments with beauty products of La Prairie and Ligne St. Barth, an ice fountain and a fitness room) and a business area.

The restaurant "Anna Sacher" reflects the charming glamour of the turn of the 19th/20th century, the "Jugendstil". It was named after the Grande Dame of the Sacher dynasty. The restaurant "Rote Bar" at the Hotel Sacher Wien offers traditional Austria and Viennese food, as well as young & stylish international dishes and has been awarded two toques in the new edition of the "Gault Millau" gourmet guide. Spoil a typical Viennese coffeehouse, Café Sacher, and enjoy the Original Sacher-Torte, alongside a wide selection of hot and cold dishes.
